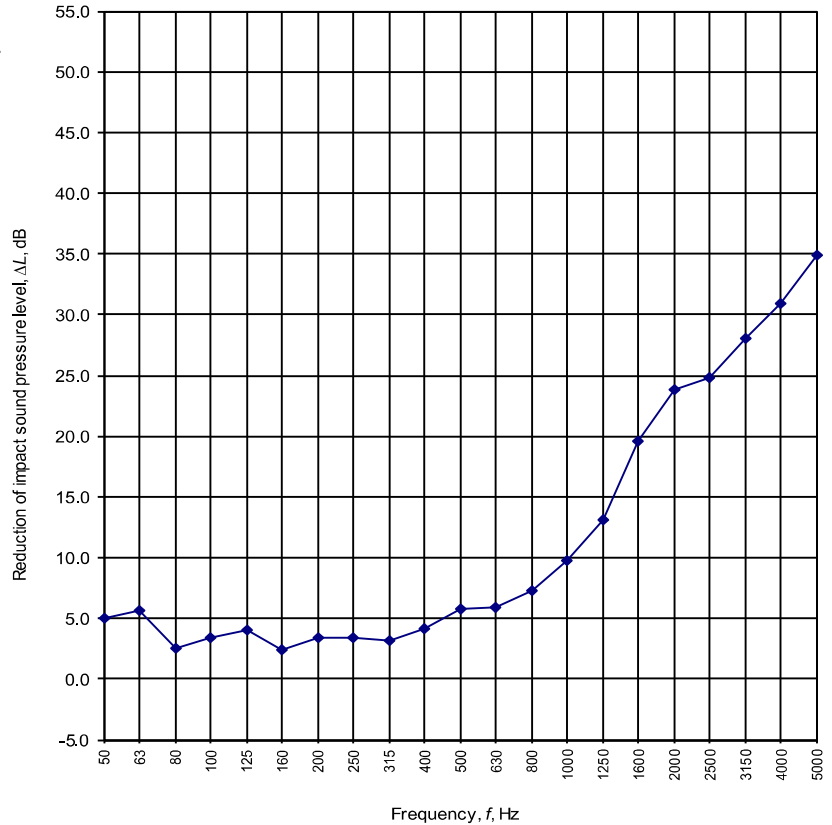
Description and identification of the test specimen and test arrangement: -

Flooring: 14 mm Pergo UNICLIC Oak timber laminate flooring (14 mm x 190 mm x 1820 mm planks)
Flooring adhesive: Uzin KE 2000S adhesive
Underlay: 4.5 mm Regupol 4515 Rubber/Cork mix underlay
Underlay Adhesive: Uzin KE 2000S adhesive
 Concrete Slab

Source chamber was Chamber A and receiving chamber was Chamber B. Test specimen installed by the client. Curing times: 24hrs
 Deviation from standard: The bare test floor used is of uniform thickness for an area of only 2.6m x 2.6m. The description of the bare test floor is given in the full report.

Air temp in the test rooms: 19 °C
 Air humidity in test rooms: 52 %
 Receiving room volume: 153 m³
